

TSC VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT



Eileen Miller has led the charge to ban distracted driving in Pennsylvania for 8 long years following the <u>loss of her son</u>, <u>Paul</u>, to a distracted truck driver. Her unyielding perseverance, buoyed by the support of her husband Paul, has made a difference. After passing the PA Senate and the House, the distracted driving bill is on the verge of being signed into law.







Daniel Dorman, his son Harvey, and his in-laws survived a terrible truck crash. All survived, but the cost of medical care quickly escalated beyond insurance limits.

A resident Iowan, Daniel was dismayed to hear about the Iowa legislature's irresponsible efforts to place arbitrary limits on motor carriers that limit claims victims need and deserve following a crash. Daniel took action and testified against the bill (SF 228/HF 201) in an IA Senate hearing AND made this powerful video to educate the public and policymakers about its unjust impacts to crash victims and how it harms truck safety.

Similar to the effort in Iowa, Florida's legislature is also pursuing unjust reforms that limit the ability of crash victims to pursue full accountability of motor carriers following a crash and limits the medical care claims they can make.

The measure also has the full support of Governor DeSantis and TSC Volunteer Jane Mathis was having **NONE** of it. Read her powerful Op-Ed opposing this ludicrous bill (HB 837) that prioritizes private profit over public safety.

TSC BOARD MEMBER DONATES \$15,000 IN HONOR OF HER FATHER

The Truck Safety Coalition is grateful for the generous individuals, corporations, and foundations whose financial support has allowed us to meet the continued high need of the truck safety community. We are excited this month to spotlight one of these dedicated donors, CRASH board member Dawn King.

Dawn's family found the Truck Safety Coalition in 2005. She was searching for answers and support after her dad was killed on December 24, 2004, by a semi-truck driven by a sleepy, overworked driver.

Among her many contributions to the fight against preventable truck crashes, Dawn is a Citizens for Reliable and Safe Highways Foundation (CRASH) Board Member and the Past President of the Truck Safety Coalition.

We spoke to Dawn about her commitment to being a leading partner for TSC. Here's a snippet of our interview.



Q: How would you describe the Truck Safety Coalition and its mission to another potential donor?

A: TSC is a group of families who have suffered unthinkable tragedy at the hands of an industry vital to our country's economy. They are diverse people across all economic levels, living across the country, from both sides of the political aisle and multiple cultures, who accomplish extraordinary things working only from their hearts.

Q: What aspects of our work are most important to you?

A: For me, the most crucial aspect of our work is the support piece, providing emotional and informational support to people in the midst of perhaps the worst moments of their lives. We provide a sense that people are not alone, that the emotional weight of the crash doesn't have to be kept inside, and that some of the grief can be released to a group that truly understands. Most people express a sense of relief at finding others like themselves and then a sense of sadness that so many of us belong to our 'truck safety family.'

Q: Do you have any advice for us to be sure you remain an enthusiastic supporter and inspire others like you to join our mission?

A: Please share your stories! The stories behind new volunteers motivates me to do more and donate more. Every time a new family joins us, their story should be shared. Public Policy Update

The 118th Congress is off and running and TSC is making a point to make sure folks have no excuse to lose sight of the truck crash crisis on our roads and the proven solutions that will make a difference. Here are just a few things to be aware of as 2023 gets underway:

• Letter to USDOT Secretary Buttigieg

TSC, joined by Advocates for Highway and Auto Safety, the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, Transportation Trades Department AFL-CIO, Consumer Federation of America, Center for Auto Safety and more urged DOT to take action on long-overdue truck safety reforms such as requiring AEB in all CMVs, strengthening Hours of Service Requirements, requiring Proficiency Testing for New Motor Carriers, and more. Letter to Senate & House Government Oversight Committees

Following the Wall Street Journal's explosive reporting on the complete lack of concern for safety in the USPS' truck freight contracting operations, TSC called for Congressional Hearings to investigate these critical safety concerns. In addition, TSC collaborated with Congressman Gerry Connolly to demand a USPS Office of Inspector General investigation as well. Following this heavy scrutiny, Wall Street Journal reports that USPS has announced a major change effective immediately: USPS leadership. This constitutes the first time, to anyone's knowledge, that USPS is tracking truck crash deaths and injuries caused by their unsafe contractors.

• Statement Opposing H.R. 471, "SHIP IT Act"

In January, U.S. Representatives Dusty Johnson (R-SD-01) and Jim Costa (D-CA-21) introduced a House Bill that is a smorgasbord of long-sought truck industry exemptions. The bill seeks weight exemptions, Hours of Service exemptions, CDL Trainee Supervision exemptions, ELD exemptions and more. It's an egregious affront to safety. Read TSC's H.R. 471 Statement HERE

• NHTSA Nominee Announced

In February, President Biden nominated Ann Carlson, current NHTSA Acting Administrator to be Administrator. Her nomination must be confirmed by the Senate and no hearings have yet been announced. TSC volunteers recently met with Acting Administrator Carlson to share our stories to motivate NHTSA leadership to act swiftly to secure truck safety gains on important issues such as Automatic Emergency Braking, Underride Guards and more.

DONOR SPOTLIGHT Q&A: RICK WATTS

Rick Watts joined the TSC community after his family was killed in a preventable truck crash.

On June 25, 2015, Rick's daughters, Kelsie, and Savannah Garrigues, arrived in Atlanta for a summer visit with their mother, Tiffany Watts. Tiffany and her mother, Sandra Anderson, picked Kelsie and Savannah up at the airport and headed home to Tennessee. Unfortunately, while stopped in construction traffic, a tractor-trailer failed to stop and collided with eight vehicles killing six people, including Tiffany, Kelsie, Savannah, and Sandra.



Q; What's your connection to the Truck Safety Coalition?

A: TSC reached out to me after the crash that killed my family. I am thankful for them doing so, as it has helped me in many ways in dealing with the aftermath of the crash.

Q: Why is the Truck Safety Coalition an organization you believe in strongly enough to support your time, talent, and treasure?

A: I believe <u>TSC does an incredible job at trying to keep the highways and interstates safe for all of us</u>, and I believe the TSC is helping to keep others from having to face what I faced with the crash that killed my family.

Q: How would you describe the Truck Safety Coalition and its mission to another potential donor?

A: If you care about the safety of your friends, family, and neighbors, this is an extremely worthwhile organization.

Q: What aspects of our work are most important to you?

A: Working with Congress and other governmental agencies to adopt and support safer roads and help to control unsafe trucking practices.
