# Sorrow to Strength 2017: April 29 – May 3







The Truck Safety Coalition is pleased to announce that we will be hosting our 2017 Sorrow to Strength Conference from May 6 – 10, in Washington, D.C.

Our conference, which occurs every two years and is designed specifically for truck crash survivors and the friends and family of truck crash victims, provides an opportunity to come together in a supportive environment, learn about truck safety issues, and advocate for truck safety improvements.

Our 2015 conference had the largest number of attendees to date and was a major success, and we are hoping to do even better in 2017. We had a greater number of attendees than ever before.

The first two days of the conference will consist of an opportunity to interact with other volunteers and to hear their stories. There will also be sessions on truck safety issues, media and social media, advocacy and going to Capitol Hill, and coping with grief.

Over the next two days, attendees, along with Truck Safety staff and volunteers, will head to Capitol Hill to meet with Members of Congress and their staffs. There will also be opportunities to meet with top officials from the Department of Transportation, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA), and National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB).

## **Truck Safety Tweets**

## **General Facts:**

- In 2015, 4,067 people were killed in large truck crashes. This number is unconscionably high.
   #trucksafetv
- Truck crashes increased by 45 percent from 2009 to 2015. Automatic emergency braking will reduce the number of crashes. #trucksafety
- Truck crash injuries shot up by 57% between 2009 and 2015, increasing from 74,000 to 116,000. #trucksafety
- In 2015, large trucks were involved in 27 percent of all fatal work zone crashes. Automatic Emergency Braking can reduce that. #trucksafety
- In 2015, there were 667 truck occupant fatalities a 34 percent increase since 2009.
   #trucksafety
- For the first time since 2008 that truck crash fatalities exceeded 4,000. #trucksafety
- In 2015, 304 children were killed in large truck crashes. As parents against tired truckers, this
  is outrageous #trucksafety

#### **Hours of Service:**

- 80% of Americans oppose legislative efforts to increase the # of hours semi-truck drivers are allowed to work in a week. #trucksafety
- 80% of Americans say they'd feel less safe if Congress raised the # of hours truckers are allowed to work in a week from 70 to 82 hours.
- Driver surveys show that 65% of drivers have reported being drowsy while driving. We need #HoursofService rules & more #trucksafety
- Driver surveys show that 48% of drivers have admitted to falling asleep while driving in the previous year. #HoursofService #trucksafety
- According to a @NIOSH study, 73% of long haul truck drivers perceived their delivery schedules unrealistically tight. #trucksafety
- According to a @NIOSH study, 37% of long haul truck drivers reported being noncompliant with hours-of-service rules. #trucksafety
- A #tiredtrucker is not the cost of doing business, but he or she can cost someone their life.
   #trucksafety
- A #tiredtrucker is not just a danger to himself, but to other motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians. #trucksafety

#### Truck Size and Weight:

- Heavier/Larger Trucks do NOT = Fewer Trucks. #trucksafety
- The # of registered trucks in the U.S. has continually increased, including after every past increase in truck size and weight limits. #trucksafety
- Longer, heavier trucks have never resulted in fewer trucks on our roads. #trucksafety

## Minimum Insurance:

- Minimum levels of insurance for trucks have not been increased in over 30 years and are woefully insufficient. #trucksafety
- Low limits for motor carriers create exactly the opposite effect that minimum insurance levels were intended to provide. #trucksafety

## Underride:

- @NTSB recommends sideguards on heavy single-unit trucks, trailers, and truck tractors.
   #underride guards save lives. #trucksafety
- The purpose of underride guards is to prevent a car from riding under the truck in the event
  of a collision. #trucksafety
- We support side underride guards on trailers because they will protect vulnerable road users like bicyclists. #trucksafety
- Side underride and rear underride collisions defeat crumple zones and prevent air bag deployment. We need more #trucksafety.

# **The United States of Fatigue?**

As you know, TSC is once again opposing an attempt to weaken the Hours of Service regulation. Truck drivers' "weekend" off and rest breaks remain in jeopardy as consideration of must-pass funding bills are occurring now. Special interest riders rolling back commonsense rules for truck driver hours of service (HOS) were tacked onto the Senate and House versions of the Transportation, Housing and Urban Development (THUD) appropriations bills. Yet, there has been NO public input, NO Congressional hearing and NO agency review of this sweeping policy change, that industry lobbyists have dubbed a small technical change.

At a time when truck crashes as well as the injuries and deaths they cause are rising, Congress should be doing more to increase truck safety, not the amount of hours that a truck driver can drive and/or work. In this past year alone, almost every state in the country has experienced a fatigue-related truck crash. We have included a list of confirmed and possible fatigue-related truck crashes by state. Please feel free to share these crashes with your elected officials and ask them what they are doing to prevent them.

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

## Why raise funds for the Truck Safety Coalition?
